10-Day, five-stop European speaking and performance tour organizes Africans dispersed throughout Europe

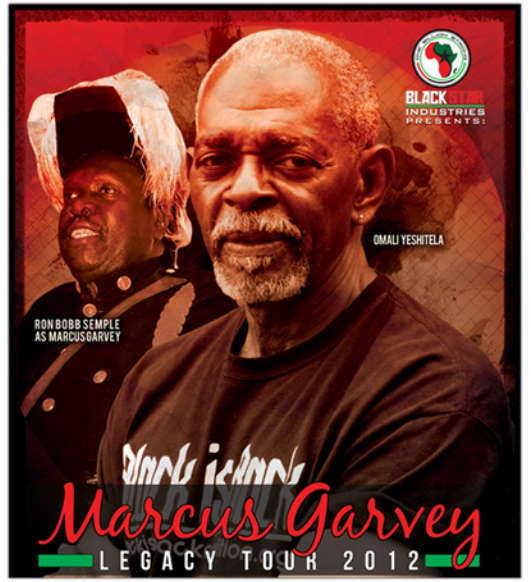
The Marcus Garvey Legacy Tour took place for the first time in Europe in 2012. In 10 days, the tour visited the United Kingdom, Stockholm, Berlin, Brussels and Belgium. The tour featured Chairman Omali Yeshitela and acclaimed actor Ron Bobb-Semple, who performed as Marcus Garvey.

The goals of the tour were to show Marcus Garvey as the great leader that he was and as the man of his time, to show the Uhuru Movement as the legacy of the Garvey Movement, to deepen the understanding of African Internationalism in this time of crisis, and to build organization among Africans dispersed throughout the world.

The tour carried a wave of enthusiasm and approval; Africans relived Marcus Garvey and the spirit of Marcus Garvey. Tour events were well-attended by both Africans and Europeans.

The Berlin tour stop took place at two venues, one of which was Humboldt University, where Karl Marx studied and which was the birthplace of socialism as Europeans know it. Here, we witnessed a major historical moment when Chairman Yeshitela presented the theory and practice of African Internationalism. He received a long standing ovation from the more than 180 people in the audience who, while predominately European, completely united with the goals of African Internationalism.

Europe will not be the same again!

Black Star Industries (BSI) takes its name from the Black Star Line shipping company that was organized by Marcus Garvey and the Universal Negro Improvement Association in 1919.

Black Star Industries is a limited liability company (LLC) that brings all of the economic development institutions and projects of the African People's Socialist Party under one umbrella.

This business model also allows Africans from throughout the world to come into partnerships with BSI, creating socialist-like community commerce by and for African people worldwide. Like Garvey's efforts, BSI organizes independent economic development for the international African community as part of the struggle for self-determination.

We cannot solve our problems alone, but with each other we can build an economy that sustains us. As Chairman Yeshitela says, "Every Nation is based on an economic foundation. A liberated economy is key to the liberation of Africa and African people worldwide."



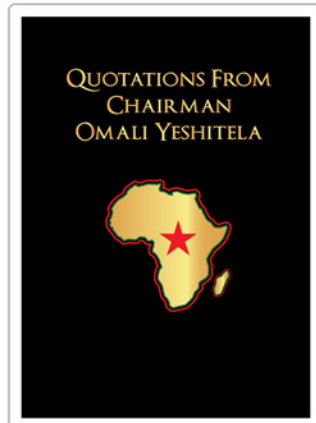
Through the leadership of Black Star Industries, Uhuru Foods and Pies is undergoing major changes to become an economic pillar for and through the African community.

Hundreds of white people from throughout the U.S. and UK joined in the Solidarity campaign to take a stand in solidarity with African liberation and to unite around the fact that reparations are due to African people.



The Solidarity campaign and events were held in conjunction with our mass organization, the Uhuru Solidarity Movement.

The African People's Solidarity Committee (APSC) was formed by the African People's Socialist Party (APSP) in 1976 as an organization for white

people under the Party's direct leadership.

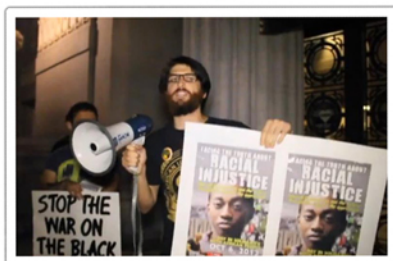
"In the APSC we learn how the world got to be the way it is, how this social system was built at a terrible price of the lives, culture and self-determination of African people and oppressed peoples everywhere," explains Penny Hess, APSC Chairwoman. "The existence of the APSC informs us about our genuine interests in changing our relationship to African people and the peoples of the world in a principled and clear way."

APSC raises resources for the work of the Party as a stand of white people's reparations to African people. APSC helps coordinate Party-led, self-reliant institutions such as the popular Uhuru Foods & Pies and the Uhuru Furniture stores. In 2013, the APSC will build the Solidarity Movement in Europe, where the presence of the African People's Socialist Party is growing. APSC is building in London; Stockholm, Sweden; Berlin and Frankfurt, Germany, as well as in Warsaw, Poland, where the first ever Day in Solidarity took place.

All African People's Development and Empowerment Project

The All African People's Development and Empowerment Project (AAPDEP) has worked tirelessly to build programs that improve the daily lives of African people worldwide.

In 2012 the All African People's Development and Empowerment Project's International Executive Committee traveled to Sierra Leone and witnessed firsthand the growth of AAPDEP's healthcare, agricultural and vocational work.

In addition to providing infant and maternal health services, AAPDEP clinics are treating victims of the recent cholera outbreak, which continues to afflict so many Africans who lack access to quality healthcare.

We expanded the programming in the Marcus Garvey Saturday School to include education in urban agriculture development. Students maintain gardens located in the heart of the Barry Farms housing projects in Washington, DC. This empowering curriculum is not available in traditional public schools.

AAPDEP also organized the successful 2012 conference, which reported on the current work and also won participation from members around the country to develop new programs for the coming year. The 2012 AAPDEP conference established a National Education Committee that will help usher in a sound, scientific education curriculum for Africans worldwide that serves our interests. The conference also established the 2013 Sierra Leone Winter Project Committee, which plans to take members from around the world into Sierra Leone. Such travel is important because it allows AAPDEP members to share expertise toward building the capacity of all AAPDEP projects. AAPDEP looks forward to 2013, in which we will continue to build the organization into a vehicle for genuine sustainability and liberation in the African world.
